 - Every pin after Silver must complete the Bronze portion plus additional portions as outlined in that section.
 - The pins in order are: Membership, Bronze, Clover, Emerald, Silver, Silver Guard, Leadership, Gold, Gold Guard.
 - 5. You may only apply for one pin per year. For Membership through Silver, the pins are not prerequisites of each other. However, if you skip a pin, you **may not** go back to that level at a later time.
 - *For example:* if you have never received a Membership or Bronze pin, but meet the requirements for a Clover, you may apply for a Clover pin. If you receive a Clover Pin, in following years you cannot apply for a Membership or Bronze Pin - you must apply for higher pins such as Emerald and Silver.
 - 6. You may **not** use the same event or project twice, examples:
 - #14 Serve on a committee in your club: Fundraising Committee
 - #15 Serve as chair of a committee in your club: Fundraising Committee

However, if you participated in different areas of an event, you could then utilize them for different numbers. Examples:

- #46 Judging contests outside local extension unit: State 4-H Photography
- #47 Compete in a skills contest at the state fair: State 4-H Crops ID
- #44 Provide leadership or volunteer at a county 4-H event: Door monitor at Multi-County Club Days
- #73 Take part in 4-H Club Days as a contestant: Performed a trumpet piece at Multi-County Club Days
