## INTRODUCTION

The purpose of Club Goal Plans is to help all local 4-H clubs in planning their own programs. They should also provide an opportunity for members and adult leaders to recognize their own accomplishments and progress.

4-H leaders and members can decide in which activities all wish to participate, in which activities some wish to participate, and in which activities none may wish to participate. They may conduct a program similar to other clubs or groups. Usually, however, their program will be somewhat different than any other because members of their group are different.

An understanding leader knows boys and girls interests sometimes change from month to month – certainly from year to year. So, their 4-H program will remain flexible, changing as the members' interests change.

Because each club or group's program will be somewhat unique, those members and leaders will be the best judge of the extent to which they were successful. Recognition of the club members' and leaders' accomplishments is more appropriately provided with a ceremony or other celebration at a local club or group meeting.

The seal that a club receives should be placed on the clubs' charter in a ceremony performed by the members and leaders that developed the clubs' goals. The seal is awarded at the county-wide Achievement Banquet in November and should be placed on the charter no later than the December meeting.

"Goals are not sticks to beat yourself with, they are merely guidelines."

#### **NEW DIMENSIONS IN 4-H**

4-H members are those boys and girls who are participating or have signified their intention to participate in any 4-H educational experience. As 4-H'ers, each have the opportunity and the privilege to participate in every 4-H educational experience offered in the community and county. To the extent possible, any participant in one of the various organizational forms – clubs, groups, events, enrichment programs – will have the opportunity to participate in any other 4-H activity.

Those and other ways of involving boys and girls are designed to help them learn five basic "life skills" they'll always use.

Healthy Interpersonal Relationships – having fun together, working as a team, taking on responsibility, and making friends.

Using Sound Decision Making – working in groups with other children or as they set goals and work independently on projects.

Developing an Inquiring Mind – helping children develop their curiosity and enthusiasm for finding out about their world and its people.

Developing a Concern for the Community – helping young people as they mature and their awareness broadens to develop a concern for their community and for others who live in it.

Building a Positive Self-Concept – supporting young members as they learn new skills and see the strides they are making with the support and help of interested adults.
